# Residential Substance Use Disorder (RSUD) Treatment Network

**Behavioral Health Division** 

# Dane County residents with Medicaid Assistance are eligible for DCDHS funding for Room and Board.

- 1. Contact your preferred RSUD provider listed in this directory. If you are seeking services in a language other than English, please contact the Behavioral Health Resource Center at (608) 267-2244.
- 2. The provider may conduct an assessment to determine your appropriate level of care.
- 3. Once accepted to a residential care center, the provider will work with Medicaid to obtain prior authorization.
- 4. The Provider will follow up with DCDHS for Room and Board billing.

# Dane County residents without insurance are eligible for DCDHS funding for RSUD treatment.

- 1. Contact the Behavioral Health Resource Center at (608) 267-2244.
- 2. You will be referred to a provider for an assessment and, if appropriate, a RSUD provider.
- 3. The provider will follow up with DCDHS for funding.

# Things to know before calling an RSUD provider.

- 1. Many factors, such as staffing shortages, may impact a Provider's capacity, programming, and admissions criteria. Please call the provider directly for the most up to date information.
- 2. Providers offer different levels of care (LOC). The LOC you need is determined by an assessment commonly known as an ASAM. RSUD providers are able to conduct these assessments, though it may save time to have an outpatient provider conduct an ASAM so that you may contact only those providers who offer your needed LOC. Contact your primary care physician or behavioral health provider for assistance. If you are not already connected with a provider, you may contact the Behavioral Health Resource Center (BHRC) at (608) 267-2244.
- 3. Make sure to discuss with the RSUD provider any concerns or questions you may have to determine if the provider is a good match for your needs. You may wish to discuss:
  - Type of programming offered
  - Medications you are taking
  - Level of interaction between residents of different genders
- Any legal history or current charges
- Medical needs
- Mobility requirements
- Cultural considerations and concerns
